Attention Riders: Lakewood Shuttle Bus Stops Now Have Proper Signage

Riders of the Lakewood Shuttle bus service now enjoy proper signs marking stops along its various routes.

Nearly a decade old, Lakewood Shuttle has developed into a full-fledged, efficient bus service connecting residential neighborhoods, shopping centers and office buildings throughout Lakewood, from Sunday through Friday. Ridership has steadily increased over the years, with over 100,000 rides a year and counting.

As riders enjoy the new signage, plans are in the works to erect bus shelters at stops for even greater visibility, plus weather protection. Lakewood Shuttle is a Lakewood Township project, facilitated in part by the Lakewood Urban Enterprise Zone (UEZ) and the Neighborhood Navigators organization.

"Every step in improving our public transportation infrastructure helps residents who are unable to drive, while mitigating congestion for other drivers on the road," says Committeeman Meir Lichtenstein. "This is a true win-win for all of Lakewood."
